Disciplinary and Regulatory Proceedings in Hong Kong was the first book of its kind and is a leading reference for anyone wishing to research and understand Hong Kong's law relating to disciplinary proceedings. There have been a number of important developments in disciplinary proceedings in Hong Kong, particularly regarding the requirements for legal representation, and the role of legal advisers.

The second edition of this formidable work includes a new section on the developing subject of claims against disciplinary bodies, especially in relation to tort. Topics like insurance brokers and agents, company secretaries and marine surveyors have been added and the profession of auditors is now written as a separate chapter. This book serves to update the reader on the ever-changing ambit of laws relating to disciplinary matters.

Since the publication of the first edition in 2011, there have been a number of new developments in disciplinary and regulatory proceedings of professions in Hong Kong. These include:

- The development of the law of misfeasance in public office in the recent high profile case involving the former Chief Secretary of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region has only proved that it is a common law offence that is developing, in both Hong Kong and the UK.
- The loop hole of ceasing to practice in order to escape disciplinary proceedings or its adverse consequent has been plugged in Chan Kin Lik.
- A revisiting of the applicable test for dishonesty in the context of disciplinary proceedings also happened (In the unreported case: Registrar of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants v Chan Kin Hang, Danvil, CACV 246/2012 22 September 2014)
- The defendant's opportunity to explain his case in disciplinary proceedings under the Browne v Dunn principle was reconsidered in Dr Fong Ka Yeung v Medical Council of Hong Kong.
- The Court of Final Appeal in Luck Continent v Cheng Chee Tock Theodore and others re-affirmed that it requires rare and exceptional cases for an appeal which is academic to be heard.
- A new section is written on claims against disciplinary body in particular in tort which appears to be a development subject in this field.
- Procedural aspects continued to be important so that lawyers approaching witness of the other side is now a topic considered by the Court of Final Appeal in HKSAR v Wong Chai Wai.
- The following professions were added: insurance brokers and agents, company secretaries, marine surveyors.
- The profession of auditors has now written as a separate chapter, previously it came under accountants.
